

A Single-use plastic checkout bags will be phased out over a six-month period. Recycled paper checkout bags will be provided at the point of check out and subject to a 25c retail compensation. Consumers are encouraged to bring their own reusable bags.

what's the narm' what will I use instead?

A: While many of us make an effort to reuse our single-use plastic checkout bags the proliferation, distribution and harmful polluting effects remain the same. Of the

trillions of plastic bags a year, 5%-32% find their way into our environment and food

system. The RCBI ordinance prohibits single-use plastic checkout bags, it does not prohibit packaged bags, produce bags newspaper bags and bread bags that may be used for garbage liners. Pet waste bags are provided at local parks and trails by the Town.

Q: Will residents on a tight budget be adversely affected by this ordinance?

Ac BYOGreenwich has many supporters or tight budgets who are already using reusable bags. Additionally, customers participating in the food program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) and customers participating in the customers participating in the Supplemental Food (SNAP) program will be given a recycled paper checkout bag at no cost when making purchases

Oz Why do we need another law?

In't an education campaign enough?

Studies show that education alone is not compelling enough to change consumer and business establishment behavior on plastic bag use. Several examples are texting & driving laws, seat belt laws, snoking laws and littering laws.
