

Forests and the Changing Climate: Evolutionary Innovation

Prof. Paul E. Olsen

Storke Memorial Professor of Geological Sciences, Lamont-Doherty Earth Observatory of Columbia University

Solutions to Deforestation:

A Global Perspective from the United Nations

Benjamin Singer

Forest Policy Officer,

United Nations Forum on Forests Secretariat

Since October 2009, Dr. Singer has been working at the United Nations Forum on Forests Secretariat in New York. In particular, he manages the Facilitative Process on forest financing, which aims to assist developing countries to mobilize funds for sustainable forest management. His work has focused primarily on Africa, least developed countries, small island developing states and low forest cover countries. He has travelled extensively to forests of Brazil, Central Africa, Madagascar and Southeast Asia, both for his studies and consultancies.
