7.3 Train Municipal Commissions

Objective

Increase the knowledge-base and effectiveness of your local boards and commissions.

What to Do

1. Send at least one commissioner from both your Inland Wetlands and Planning and Zoning Commissions (one representative per commission), as well as two commissioners from other active commissions of your choice, to an equity training session or another training session that is relevant to their commission. The training may be online, or inperson, in your community or a neighboring community. You may partner with neighboring towns to invite your council of government to provide a training session. The type of training can be loosely interpreted to meet the needs of your municipality; whether it's an event, workshop, webinar, conference, etc. Activities that are used to earn points toward this Action may not be used to earn points toward any other Sustainable CT Action (i.e., no "double-counting").

Submit: The name of each commissioner and their associated commission, who attended a training, as well as the name and date of the training.
